

September 2016— BC communities once again honor **National Forest Week (NFW)**, whose theme this year is "**Canada's Forests - True North, Strong and Green**". To raise awareness of the almost century-old NFW event, September 18-24, 2016, FORED BC is again offering a provincial poster contest for youths.

Using renewable, wood-based products keeps our forests healthy and sustainable. Lots of things are made of wood: houses, furniture, floors, cabinets, doors, photo frames, paper and packaging, etc. Some of the most popular woods are harvested right here in Canada. - Deadline for poster submission is October 31, 2016 and must be postmarked by that same date. All posters become the property of FORED BC.
- Participants <u>must</u> note their <u>name</u>, <u>postal address</u>, <u>phone and email address and/or grade</u>, <u>teacher</u>, <u>school</u>, <u>& school postal & email addresses on the back of all posters or in covering emails</u>, so we can contact winners.
- All artistic mediums accepted: i.e. pencil, crayon, paint, mural, collage, etc. Scanned posters may be emailed to education@foredbc.org in high-resolution.jpg (300dpi) format.
- Size: 8.5"x11" to 11"x17" paper with theme: "Canada's Forests True North Strong & Green"
- Due to the large volume of entries, FORED cannot return posters. Only winners will be notified. By participating, winners agree that their names and posters can be published in local media. Previous winners can be viewed at:
